| <p>Camper/RV hook-up/Tenting/Trailer Parking</p> | <p>Starting in 2019, we will be having assigned Camper/RV hook-up/Tenting. Please specify on your entries whether you need electrical and/or water for your Camper/RV. Assigned spots just like we do stall assignments will be sent out before the show begins. | <p>Awards:</p> | <p>Dressage Divisions (Junior/Young, Adult Amateur, and Open) will be run concurrently as one class and pinned separately by division if there are 6 or more in a class. Hunter/Jumper divisions will be pinned together as one. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as OPEN -- exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement. Riders may enter only one division per class. Ribbons to 6th place.</p> |
| <p>Gamblers Choice:</p> | <p>The Gamblers Choice you choose your own course over fences to earn points assigned to each fence. Highest point count wins. This class is a payback class. Donations towards the Payback jackpot will be accepted in the office up until the start of the class.</p> |
| <p>Hunter/Jumper Highpoint:</p> | <p>Highpoint will be awarded overall for both days combined. Classes must have three people in them in order for the points to count towards Highpoint.</p> <p>A Reserve Champion & Champion will be awarded for each day in each division.</p> |
| <p>TIP Awards:</p>  | <p>High Score Dressage Thoroughbred (Overall) Hunter High Point Thoroughbred Award Jumper High Point Thoroughbred Award Young Dressage High Point Thoroughbred Award</p> |
| <p>Non-compete horses:</p> | <p>\$30 Weekend - for horses on grounds and not competing in the show. Must fill out entry form for number and pay office fee and stabling.</p> |
| <p>Confirmation of Entry:</p> | <p>Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed to the rider. All e-mail addresses must be clearly printed. If you do not receive a confirmation from Fox Village by Monday prior to the show please email me at galahad_galapard@hotmail.com to confirm I received your entry.</p> |

| Ride Times: | Unofficial ride times will posted to www.foxvillage.com no later than Tuesday before the show. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the unofficial ride times. Official ride times will be posted in the show office by NOON the day before the competition starts. |
| Payment: | Payment is due at the time entries are mailed to show management. Entries not accompanied by fees will be considered late and not entered until fees are received including any late fees. Online entries taken at www.equestrianentries.com with a credit card. Make checks payable to NWDA. |
| Entry Scratches & Refunds: | There will be no refunds given after the closing date without a written Veterinary or Doctors note. The note must be received by NWDA no more than 30 calendar days from the closing date. The NWDA Board will review each request on a case by case basis. Refunds that are deemed appropriate will be given in show credit form for the amount of the <i>class fees ONLY</i> . |
| Stabling: | Stall deposit required for each entry to be refunded after management ok's clean stall. Initial bedding is not provided. You may bring your own shavings please do not use straw or pellets for bedding. Shavings may be ordered on entry for \$8 per bag or purchased at the show while supplies last. All horses must be stabled; no jump-outs allowed. Stabling is available after 3:00 pm the day before the show. |
| Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy: | Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, Accidents or Emergencies. |
| Arenas/Footing: | Two standard 20m x 60m competition rings, both with sand footing. The warm-up is sand footing or sand over grass. No lunging in large warm-up ring on show days; lunging only in grass area. The Competition Arenas may be ridden in until sundown Friday evening. Saturday use of the warm up and competition rings is available at the conclusion of the show Saturday until sundown. |
| Medical: | Medical personnel will be on grounds. Ambulance on call. |
| Other: | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash • Smoking is not permitted in or near barns, show office or competition arena/warm-up. |

| Directions: | I-35 North to Highway 2 East (exit 253A). Cross the bay into Superior, WI. Turn left at stoplight. Follow Highway 2 (Belknap St) to Barker's Island. Turn right at junction of Highways 2 and 53. Follow Highways 2/53 out of Superior. Hwy 53 will split off to the right/South. Take Hwy 2, the LEFT split and continue to follow Hwy 2 through Wentworth, Poplar, and Brule. Before the Town of Iron River, there is a lake on the right and a sign on the right hand side of the road that says, "Fairgrounds." Turn left and follow to fairgrounds, approx. ¾ mile. |

| <p>Team formation:</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Minimum of 3 team members. Maximum of 5 team members. Team members can be riding at different levels/height levels. Any individual rider needing team members is encouraged to contact the show secretary and a mixed team will be formed. • In order for a test score/point placing(hunter/jumpers) to be calculated towards your teams Team Competition results a \$5 qualifying fee per class entered must be paid before placing is earned. A minimum of 1 and a maximum of 3 classes may be entered towards your Team Competition Score. Any class with the \$5 qualifying fee next to it you are able to qualify with. • Riders may not compete on two different teams with the same horse. Riders and horses may only be a member of a single team once. Riders may participate on a different horse on a different team, but one rider may not ride more than one horse on a team. Likewise, a horse may participate with a different rider on a different team, but may not participate with two riders on the same team. • Team formations can be made of both Dressage & Hunter/Jumper riders • Team names: Make sure to include your team name and members on your entry form or you can email your team name and members to Carrie Calder at galahad_galapard@hotmail.com |
| <p>Awards:</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team Spirit Award: All riders are encouraged to support their fellow teammates by helping each other braid, tack up, get dusted off, watch each other's rides, and applaud each other's efforts! A special award will be awarded to the team who best displays team spirit. • Team medallions on neck ribbons will be awarded to each team member for first through sixth place. • Riders are expected to be dressed in riding clothes and mounted for the awards ceremony held on Saturday immediately after the final class. |
| <p>General Team Competition Information:</p> | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Team riders can compete at any level. Single team members are allowed to ride at different levels/heights. For example Training 3 & First 1. Results will be calculated based on your placing and a point system will be used according to the class size that you are in. The team points will be used to place the teams. • Tests may be read and whips allowed. |

Dressage Championship Class Information(Sunday)

Ability to qualify & enter up until end of show day Saturday. Applicable class fees apply. If you wish to scratch your Sunday ride to enter a Championship class you will not be refunded the entry fee of your scratched class.

- Tests ridden from memory
- No whip
- Highest test of the level
- Horses must be braided
- Show jacket/solid colored polo shirt and breeches of light color
- Must be present at awards ceremony in full show attire

TOC Ride A Test Class(Saturday)

The Ride a Test classes will be offered Saturday afternoon only. Entries will be limited and will be scheduled in 30 minute time slots. How it will look:

- Rider will ride TOC for judge. Judge will judge said test.
- Judge will then give rider on the spot feedback and will coach said rider to better their test
- Rider will then re-ride the same test and judge will re-judge after feedback has been given

Prix Caprilli(Saturday)

Test 1)

- Designed for horses with jumping experience and showing Training Level Dressage or above
- Maximum height of fences is 18"
- Trot work is to be posted

Test 2)

- Designed for horses with jumping experience and showing First Level Dressage or above
- Maximum height of fences is 2'
- Trot work may be either sitting or posting, unless noted.
- Changing leads may be done as a flying change or through the trot

In the working gaits the jumping horse is not expected to be as round as a straight dressage horse but the horse must softly accept the bit and show more roundness in the non-jumping parts of the tests. Refusals will be penalized as error of course. Knockdowns will be penalized at judge's discretion. If a rail is in the way, the judge will ring the bell for rider to stop until the rail is replaced. The judge will then ring the bell/whistle for the rider to start where he/she left off. Copies of tests will be placed on NWDA website and in upcoming newsletters.
