Levels:	USDF Introductory through FEI Grand Prix, including Open, Junior/Young Rider and Adult Amateur classes, as well as Opportunity Classes.
Entries:	Online Entries at www.horsehowoffices.com <i>One entry per horse/rider combination per day/show – please print clearly. Completed entries (all three signatures, copies of all association cards, and a copy of a negative current year Coggins Test (with horse's show name – per USEF rule GR907.4). Show participants must have a copy of horse's vaccination records (per USEF rule GR845)) available on grounds at all times. Entries must be postmarked by the closing date. Please be prepared to show original coggins, when you check-in (per state law). USEF and USDF non-membership fee(s) are not required for Intro Classes and Opportunity Classes. Horses are limited to a maximum of three Dressage rides per day at Fourth Level and below (including Rider Tests) or two Dressage rides per day above Fourth Level. Horses competing at both Fourth Level and Prix St. Georges, or their equivalents, are limited to two Dressage rides per day. Dressage Seat Equitation, Quadrille, Pas de Deux and Materiale classes are excluded from the maximum limit of rides per day and horses in these classes may compete at any level for which they are otherwise eligible during the same competition. See USEF Rule DR119.2. Horses may enter no more than two consecutive levels, Freestyle levels included, at any one competition. See USEF Rule DR119.2.</i>

<p>Team Competition (Saturday Only):</p> <p>Team Awards:</p>	<p>On Saturday you may elect to be part of the TEAM COMPETITION. Teams must consist of three horse/rider combinations. No horse or rider can ride twice for the same team; no combination can compete on two teams; no more than two FEI combinations per team; no more than one professional rider per team. Team riders may compete at any level. Single team members are also allowed to ride at different levels. The lowest single score of the team will be dropped. The remaining scores will be handicapped according to the scale listed below the class listing, and averaged to obtain a team score. Scratches or eliminations for any reason will be considered a zero score and counted as either the low drop score for the team, or handicapped and computed into the team average score if more than one scratch/elimination occurs on a team. Non-FEI riders must have two scores/rides, and FEI riders must have 1 score/ride.</p> <p>Saturday: There will be awards for the Team Competition. Team fees paid will go towards a cash prize, the winning team will get 60%, second place 25%, third place 15%.</p>
<p>Awards:</p> <p>Champion, Reserve Champion</p> <p>Weekend Champion and Reserve Champion</p> <p>Musical Freestyle and TIP</p> <p>Partner show for National Pony Cup</p>	<p>Divisions (Junior/Young, Adult Amateur, Open) may be run concurrently as one class and will be pinned separately. Riders must clearly specify division choice. When no designation is made, riders will automatically be entered as OPEN -- exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement. Riders may enter only one division per class. Ribbons to 6th place and trophy in all classes/divisions with 3 or more entries.</p> <p>Daily Champion and Reserve Champion Highpoint Awards will be offered each day and will be pinned by the division (Jr/Yr, AA, and Open) Introductory Level will be awarded highpoint separately by the day not by the division</p> <p>Weekend Highpoint Champion and Reserve Champion we be awarded for combined weekend scores, excluding freestyle scores</p> <p>Musical freestyle Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded by the weekend, but not by division. Jockey Club TIP Highpoint awarded for overall TB in Dressage and overall young TB in dressage.</p> <p>The NDPC will send each Partner Show a High Point & Reserve High Point ribbons, which will be presented at the show, based on pony only classes</p>
<p>Definitions:</p> <p>Adult Amateur</p> <p>Junior-Young Rider</p>	<p>Adult Amateur= Individuals possessing current amateur certification are only eligible as Adult Amateurs from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach age 22. USDF rule DR119.3 Only active USEF members may obtain amateur status. Exception: Equine Canada members in possession of current EC membership may sign for USEF Amateur status and qualify under the USEF Amateur rules. If opportunity classes at Dressage Competitions are restricted to amateurs, riders are required to have amateur status with USEF. Junior/Young Rider = Open to Junior & Young Riders only. Individuals are eligible as JR's until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 18. Individuals are eligible as YR;s from the beginning of th calendar year which they reach 16 until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age 21 See USEF rule DR119.3</p>

Late Entries:	\$35 – if received after the closing/received by date.
Post Entries:	\$10 plus normal class fee – Post entries accepted ONLY if time allows.
Non-competing horses:	\$30 per day – for horses not competing in the show. Must fill out entry form for number and pay office fee. No USEF/USDF fees need to be paid.
Confirmation of Entry:	Confirmation of entry will be e-mailed to the rider. All email addresses must be clearly printed. Make sure you turn off your spam filter for horseshowoffice emails.
Great American/ USDF Qualifying Classes:	Please indicate that the class is to count for qualifying by designating a Q after the class number. Qualifying will not require a separate ride. An exhibitor riding in the Open, Adult Amateur, or Junior/Young rider classes will pay an additional \$15 USDF fee (must be paid prior to start of the class) to have the score entered in the Great American/USDF qualifying division at that level. Qualifying classes count towards the 2024 Great American/USDF Regional Championships. Check the www.usdf.org for regional 2024 qualifying dates, score requirements and locations of championships.
Payment:	Payment is due at the time entries are mailed to show management in US funds. This competition accepts mailed payment with personal check, cashier's check or money order. Entries not accompanied by fees will be considered late and may not be entered until fees are received including any late or post entry fees. Please contact the show secretary with any questions. Online entries taken at www.horseshowoffice.com with a credit card or echeck. Make checks payable to NORTH WOODS DRESSAGE ASSOCIATION or NWDA and mail to the COMPETITION SECRETARY:
Entry Cancellation and Refunds:	Cancellations only in writing either by mail or e-mail prior to or on the closing date. Entry fees refunded with veterinarian or doctor's certificate before closing date, minus the office fee. NO REFUNDS , including stall and office fees, for any reason after the OFFICIAL, PUBLISHED closing date, even if the closing date is extended. SEE USEF rule GR911 for substitution of rider.
No Shows:	All “No Shows” that have not contacted the show office, prior to the start of the show, may be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and time slots will be filled. Exhibitors enter with this understanding and agreement.
Ride Times:	Unofficial ride times will be posted to www.horseshowoffice.com after 6:00 p.m. prior to the show. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform show management of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the unofficial ride times. Please DO NOT call for ride times. Official ride times will be posted in the show office by NOON the day before the competition starts.
Opportunity Classes:	1.) Open to those new to showing dressage. Horses and riders competing in “opportunity” classes are exempt from USEF and USDF membership requirements, and do not have to pay non-member or HID fees or USEF drug fees. “Opportunity” riders/horses will be allowed to cross-enter into other recognized classes at the show, but must pay all applicable USEF and USDF fees. 2.) Opportunity classes follow all USEF Dressage Division rules and applicable USEF general rules, including dressage and saddlery. 3.) Opportunity classes cannot be used as qualifying classes for the Great American/USDF Regional Championships.
Stabling: SEPARATE check must be provided by stall deposit to: NWDA	Stall deposit required for each entry, \$30.00 per entry, to be refunded after management oks the clean stall. \$100.00 from Friday to Sunday per horse for regular stalls, \$135 for premium/large stalls. \$60.00 per day or portion thereof for either regular horse or tack stall. Permanent and temporary stalls with doors, on the show grounds. No initial bedding is provided. You may bring your own shavings or purchase bags through the show office – please do not use straw or pellets for bedding. To order, please indicate the number of bags you wish to receive on your entry form. Shavings may be ordered on entry for \$10 per bag or purchased at the show while supplies last. Stalls range in size from 8’x8’ to 12’x12’, some 10’x16’ available – please select Premium Stabling option for Dairy Barn, Dressage Barn or double size 4H barn stall (12’x12’ and 10’x16’) requests. All horses must be stabled; no jump-outs allowed. Stabling is available after 3:00 pm the day before the show. No late arrivals after 8:00 pm unless show management grants permission for late arrival. Please plan your arrival accordingly. Special requests honored on a <u>first-come, first-serve basis on or after the opening date</u> , based upon receipt of entry. Large horses may receive large stall priority based on management discretion. Stallion owners need to bring suitable equipment to close off the stall if necessary, for safety.
Sharps Containers	Sharps containers will be placed near each stabling area. Per USEF Rule GR1210.4, Competition Management may fine any individuals including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.

Camper/RV/Hook-up	\$35 per night RV with electric, \$20 tent camping no electric Camping will be assigned on a "first come, first serve" based upon receipt of entry.
Weather/Acts of God/Accidents or Emergency Policy:	Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any Championship or qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, acts of God, accidents or emergencies. Poor Air quality over 151 is considered an act of God.
Arenas/Footing:	Two standard 20m x 60m competition rings, both with sand footing. The warm-up is sand footing or sand over grass. No lunging in large warm-up rings on show days; lunging only in grass areas or sand footing round pen.
Medical:	Medical personnel will be on the grounds. Ambulance on call.
Farrier: Kevin Lindemood	Will be on call; see the show office.
Veterinarian: Dr. Dan Bloomquist	Will be on call; see the show office.

Food:	Limited food service available on the show grounds during normal show hours.
Warning:	Under the Equine Activity Liability Act, each participant who participates in an equine activity expressly assumes the risks of engaging in and legal responsibility for injury, loss, or damage to person or property resulting from the risk of equine activities.
Other:	Per USEF rule (GR1301.6): Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds and must be on a leash (not to exceed 6 feet in length) or otherwise contained (in a tack stall/cage etc.). Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule may be subject to penalty by USEF, as well as issuance of warning cards. Loose animals or animals left in vehicles in distress, etc., can and will be removed from the grounds at the owner's expense.
Freestyle Entries:	Effective December 1, 2019 - DR129.9: Except for USEF/USDF Championship classes and for FEI Pony Riders, FEI Junior, FEI Young Rider and FEI Para-Equestrian Freestyles, in order to enter a freestyle class at any level, a horse/rider combination must have received a minimum score of 63% for Training through Fourth levels and 60% for FEI levels in the highest test of the declared freestyle level or any test of a higher level at a USEF/USDF licensed Dressage Competition, Federation Licensed or FEI recognized Dressage Competition, or open Dressage class (i.e. open to all breeds) at a Federation Licensed Competition held prior to the competition where the horse/rider combination is entered to ride a freestyle class. A photocopy of the test verifying eligibility, or copy of the USDF score verification, must be submitted with the entry for a freestyle class. Please note: A 60% or higher earned by a horse/rider combination at the FEI levels may be applied for a Freestyle ridden at a lower level. See USEF Rule DR129.9. Training Level musical freestyles are ineligible for Regional Championship qualifying.
Submitting your freestyle music	E mail your freestyle MP3 or zip file music to Kathi Marshall, kkmarsshallNWDA@gmail.com when you send in your entry, or No later than 48 hours before the show, include riders name, horses name, freestyle level. Bring a backup of music on a flash drive to the show.
Protective Headgear:	From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. See USEF Rule DR120.6.
Pony Measurements:	Any person wanting pony measurements must contact the show secretary TWO WEEKS before the show to ensure the presence of a certified measurement stick and arrange for the vet to be on the grounds. There may be a fee of no more than \$100 per pony associated with measurement.
Accommodations:	Lumbermen's Inn (Iron River): 715-372-4515; Brule River Motel (Brule): 715-372-4817; Holiday Inn Express (Superior) 715-392-3444. Top of the Morn Resort Cabins, Iron River 715-372-4546 (See NWDA website for more information.)
Directions:	I-35 North to Highway 2 East (exit 253A). Cross the bay into Superior, WI. Turn left at stoplight. Follow Highway 2 (Belknap St) to Barker's Island. Turn right at the junction of Highways 2 and 53. Follow Highways 2/53 out of Superior. Hwy 53 will split off to the right/South. Take Hwy 2, the LEFT split and

continue to follow Hwy 2 through Wentworth, Poplar, and Brule. Before the Town of Iron River, there is a lake on the right and a sign on the right hand side of the road that says, "Fairgrounds." Turn left and follow to the fairgrounds, approx. ¾ mile.
