#### USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

#### **VOLUNTEER ROLES at NWDA SHOWS**

Volunteering at one of our NWDA shows earns you show credits as well as fulfilling your 4 hour volunteer requirement for NWD Year End Awards. Show credits can be used to pay for your class fees at future shows or to attend our clinics and educational lectures. Most show roles get paid ten dollars an hour in show credits; scribes earn fifteen dollars per hour in show credits,

Stall Check and Labeling (Friday 12-2PM): Check that stalls are clean and in good shape. Report any issues to the show manager. Label the stalls with the competitors' and horses' names. Check with show secretary about the number of shavings each competitor purchased and deliver those to their stalls.

Ring Set Up (Friday 12-2 PM): The dressage ring components are located in the grey NWDA trailer parked by the corner of the ring closest to the woods. There is a measuring tape in the show office to help you accurately place the letters. There are faux flowers to put in the letters for decoration in the trailer. Put white cones between the two rings on both ends to prevent people from walking their horses between the two rings. Make a cone barrier by the judge's booth by ring 1 as well to help prevent people from walking in front of the judging booth.

Announcer (Saturday/Sunday for the duration of the show day): We will give you a tutorial on how to use the sound equipment in the morning. We have written directions and a YouTube video as well to help you. Please show up 30 minutes early, minimum, if you are unfamiliar and need help learning it. Use the show day sheets to keep track of the competitors and announce riders as they come into the ring and the next couple riders who will be up next in the ring. Should there be any musical freestyles, the announcer is the DJ for those rides. We will help you set up the freestyle music.

Test Runner (Saturday/Sunday for the duration of the show day): Pick up completed tests from the judge's booths and run them to the show secretary in the office. You can take tests every few rides. Only approach the booth between rides.

Ring Steward and Tack Check (Saturday/Sunday for the duration of the show day): Keep track of who is in the warm up ring and show ring. We will give you day sheets

so you know where everyone is supposed to be and at what time. We also have a white board that can be used to write down all the rides for the day in order. You can then erase each rider as they exit the show ring. This helps provide a visual for riders of how many rides they have until their ride and reduces the number of questions and interruptions. 1/3 of the riders in each class need to have their tack checked after their rides. Choose those people ahead and mark it on your day sheets. We will mark off the maximum length whips can be on the picnic table by the ring with tape so you can measure the whips. We have laminated sheets with USDF legal bits for you to reference.

Scribe (Saturday/Sunday for the duration of the show day): The judge will give you a score and then a comment for each box. The score is the most important thing to record so always make that priority if the judge's comments are lengthy. Give yourself enough time in the morning to familiarize yourself with the tests you will be scribing that day. Make sure you have a functional black pen to make notes and a red pen to mark errors or use of voice. Grab a bell or whistle for your judge too. The show office will give you a packet containing your day sheet, your test sheets, and either a bell or whistle.. Make sure you have a stopwatch or cellphone with battery to time the musical freestyles as those have a time limit. There is a great article on USDF web site on common scribing abbreviations.

**Office Help** (Saturday/Sunday for the duration of the show day): Help the show secretary to enter and calculate show scores as tests are brought to the office.

#### VOLUNTEERS NEEDED!

June 8-9 Schooling Show June 22-23 Recog. Show July 20-21 Recog. Show Aug 3-4 Schooling Show Ring Take Down (Sunday after the show has concluded): Clean and pack away the ring cones and boards in the grey NWDA trailer located by the corner of ring 2. (Ring next to the woods)

Other small odd jobs you could help with include pulling boards in the arena at lunch so that the rings can be dragged and watered, helping set up for the competitors party, and helping with stall checks at the end of the

show. If you have free time and would like to help, chances are we can find something for you to do!

Many of these roles are currently unfilled for the remaining two shows of the season. Please consider signing up for a slot and helping us to continue to host shows as a GMO. If you can't serve for a whole day, there are some jobs which require a shorter time commitment. Really any job, except scribing, could be shared by more than one person if you and a partner wanted to split the day.

#### 2024 New Volunteer Requirement for NWDA Year End Awards

Startng in 2024 there will be a four hour yearly volunteer requirement to be eligible for NWDA Year End Awards. You can volunteer at an NWDA event, at spring cleanup, the banquet, etc to fulfill this requirement, but does not pay Show Credits.

**Volunteering at one of our Shows during the summer earns you Show Credits as well as fulfilling your four hour requirement.** You will earn 10.00/hour worth of credits for volunteering at shows. To incentivize volunteering as a scribe the show credit rate for that role is higher at 15.00/hour. A great way to make your show dollars spread farther. A family member or friend can complete your annual volunteer requirement. In case of unforeseen circumstances, and you cannot fulfill the volunteer position you signed up for, you are required to find someone to fill your position or no Year End Award. Please let the volunteer coordinator knowas, soon as possible, if you cannot attend.

Please record your hours on the sheets provided at the shows or email the volunteer coordinator the event and hours you worked so that they can be recorded.

Volunteer credits may be used to pay for your class fees at any of our future NWDA shows or educational events. To redeem them, sign up and pay for your classes when you do your online or mail in registraon as you would normally do. Then at the show you may ask for a refund check from NWDA in the show office.

Show credits expire two years a er the date on which they were earned.

#### US Equestrian Introduces Microchip rule for Equine Health & Safety effective 12/1/25

The US Equestrian Federation strives to consistently ensure the safety and welfare of both our human and equine athletes. One fundamental aspect of equine safety is microchiping. Microchips in horses allow for immediate onsite verification of horses for the purpose of safe guarding the health of each horse. This is vital, especially during times of disease outbreaks or natural disasters.

To this end, the US Equestrian Board of Directors approved a new microchiping rule, effective December 1 2025, under GR1101.1, all horses competing in USEF licensed or endorsed competitions must be microchipped with a 15 digit ISO compliant 11784 11785 chip.

#### Air Quality requirements for all NWDA Shows

As we enter the summer months, we all must be aware of the weather around us. We have had a watchful eye on the wildfires spreading throughout Canada, and the resulting worsened air quality throughout Canada and the United States. We know concerns over air quality are ever-present as both humans and equines can be equally impacted. USEF believes the decision by organizers to operate, suspend, or cancel competitions due to compromised air quality is best made by each individual organizer, because venue conditions can vary and can change rapidly depending upon weather, geography, and other factors. In order to make the most informed decision, competition organizers must consult with state and local health authorities and government agencies and should frequently review the guidelines involving air quality at AirNow.gov to determine whether or not to operate their events. Additionally, to best protect the health and safety of both equine and human competitors, the USEF strongly recommends that, in situations where the Air Quality Index (AQI) reaches 151 or above, an organizer consider suspending or canceling competition. NWDA will follow the USEF recommendation that shows may be suspended or canceled if the Air Quality Index reaches 151 or above.

In cases of cancellation, Show Manager and Show Secretary will warn competitors by email before the show commences of cancellation, after conferring with the Technical Delegate, Dr Dan Bloomquist, Veterinarian and AirNow.gov. In case of cancellation, it will be considered an Act of God, and non- refundable for all shows.

#### USDF Rule on Barn lights change for 2024 at Shows.

Barn lights will be required to be turned off at 10pm, to help the horses get the sleep they need

This person must be present and is the person who is named if the horse is drug tested or in the case of charge for abuse. Parents signing as Trainer/coach, Must have an active memership & cannot purchase a Show Pass \*\*COACH on the entry form is the person who teaches a competitor before the class and may be a different person than the Trainer.

\*\*\* Memberships/Registrations/ Recordings must be valid **prior** to the qualifying ride

Rider, owner ,trainer and coach can all be the same person

\*\*\*\* Show pass fee must be obtained from USEF website, BEFORE the show, can not be obtained at the show

#### Check the Equipment and Dress Code Sections of the of the Schooling Show FAQ or Recognized Show FAQ to familiarize yourself with the correct procedure. Rec Shows, trainer & coach if listed must be USEF members, they cannot get show pass

- 1. Most riders will bring their horse to the show ground on the Friday before the show starts. Competition managers ask that you do not arrive until <u>after 3 pm Friday</u>. If you plan to arrive earlier, you must contact the competition manager listed on the show bill. Once you arrive, please head straight to the show office to check in and find your stall assignment.
- 2. Lunging: Competitors may lunge in the grass area next to the warm-up arena.
- 3. **Unsupervised horses in small arena behind 4H Barn:** It is mandatory to be with your horse at all times if they are turned out in the small arena outside of 4H barn.
- 4. Schooling:

**Friday:** Dressage and Hunter JJumper competitors may school in the designated warm-up areas and competition arenas until sundown on Friday evening

**Show Days:** Dressage and Hunter Jumper competitors may school in the designated warm-up areas throughout the show day. Riders may not school in the designated dressage competition rings the morning of and while the show is in progress. Please check with Jen Hovde for available Hunter Jumper schooling in the Hunter Jumper rings the mornings of the show. Schooling in the designated competition rings after the show until sundown is permitted.

**5. What do I do before my ride time?** Before you ride, familiarize yourself with the ring you ride in and the numbers of the riders who ride before you. Remember your number and ASTM SEI approved helmet with strap Both are required.

**Dressage:** As you make your way to the warm-up area, check in with the ring steward to let them know you have arrived. Keep in mind, the ring steward may also be the announcer. The ring steward can tell you if the classes are running ahead or behind. If the rings are running ahead of time, remember you **do not** have to go early. You may school your horse until your ride time.

**Hunter/Jumper:** The ring does not run on the time schedule, so please check with the ring steward or show manager for how the ring is running that day. It is the responsibility of the rider to be at the ring at the time the class begins.

#### FAQ for NWDA shows, continued

#### 6. It's my ride time! What now?

**Dressage Competitors:** When the rider ahead of you is preparing to finish their test, start getting ready to head over to the ring. Once the rider ahead of you does their final salute, head to the ring. **DO NOT** ride in front of the other judge's booth.

Once at the judge's booth of the ring you will ride in, tell the scribe your number. You may now do final preparations along side the ring until the judge signals you (bell/whistle). You now have 45 seconds to enter the ring. Don't panic! Remember to salute at both halts!

Once your ride is over, head to the ring steward area for a treat ( and equipment check for a recognized show).

#### **Hunter/Jumper Competitors:**

Check in with the in gate/ring steward as the H/J ring runs the classes in order, but not on a time schedule. Keep in mind that riders in all classes, other than group classes, may run in a different order than what is posted. Check the courses posted in the in gate area - memorize the course that is assigned to your class. When it is your turn for your jumping round, head into the arena. If you are doing a hunter/eq course, you may need to do a courtesy circle before and/or after your ride. If you are riding a jumper course, you may enter the arena, but wait for the whistle before starting your course.

#### 7. We made it! Where do I see how I did?

Dressage scores and tests will be available in the show office once the class is done and the show secretary has scored them. We make every effort to post Hunter/Jumper scores earlier, but they may not be posted until lunch and at the end of the show day. Please be patient as everyone is working as fast as they can.

#### 8. Competitors Party/ High Point

Join us in the show office for appetizers and drinks on Saturday a half hour after the last ride! Here we will be announcing our High Point winners for the day, so be sure to join us in congratulating them!

#### 9. Some final things to keep in mind:

**Refunds for schooling shows:** There will be no refunds given after the closing date without a written Veterinary or Doctors note. The note must be received by NWDA no more than 30 calendar days from the closing date. The NWDA Board will review each request on a case by case basis. Refunds that are deemed appropriate will be given in show credit form for the amount of the class fees ONLY.

Refunds for Recognized Shows: Due to USEF and USDF rules, we are unable to give refunds after the closing date.


**Outstanding Fees:** Participants who are financially negligent to the show (incomplete payment of fee) will not be allowed to compete for prizes and will be advised not to enter any future shows until payments are completed in full.

**Competition spectators:** When not competing, please make sure everyone keeps a reasonable distance away from the judge's booths during the competition. Friends/family taking pictures and video is encouraged! However, they must give the riders the right of way and not distract the judges.

**Cancellations/substitutions**: All Substitutions must be cleared through the show manager or secretary with adequate time for the show management to notify the judge and other officials. Requests must be made by 3pm the day before. After Closing Date change fees:

- \* One-time Class add-on or time change Dressage \$5 Hunter/Jumper \$10
- \* Horse and/or rider change: \$15
- \*Horse and/or rider change due to injury: \$0

**Inappropriate Behavior:** Participants in NWDA shows are encouraged to show civil, sportsmanlike behavior when dealing with all volunteers, employees, other participants, and participant's family members while on the grounds. Inappropriate, argumentative, or aggressive behavior, body language, words, or attitudes will result in automatic scratching of all future classes at said competition.



#### **Equine Vaccination Rule**

#### Required for ALL NWDA Shows




#### **GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule**

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions, horses entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhino- pneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the fol- lowing methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- 2. In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.

Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.

# Schooling Shows

#### Schooling Show, some of the Class descriptions

**Dressage Equitation:** Open to riders who have not shown above Second Level. Horses will be shown in a group and asked to perform, at minimum, walk, trot, and canter in both directions. Other possible movements may include, but not limited to: leg-yield, lengthened gaits, halt, turn on the forehand, and riding without stirrups. To be judged on rider's hands, seat, position, and use of aids.

**Leadline:** Ages 12 and under, led at the walk only. Ribbons only. Riders may not enter any riding classes.

**Hunter:** Horse is judged on performance and soundness with an emphasis on manners. Extreme speed will be penalized. Under saddle classes to be shown as a group.

**Hunt Seat Equitation:** Rider to be judged on use of seat, legs, and hands. Classes on the flat shown in a group.

Jumper: Jumping rounds to be judged on penalties (knockdowns, faults, refusals, and time) only.

**TOC Ride-A-Test:** Rider will choose a test to ride in front of the judge twice. The rider enters the ring and rides test like a typical dressage test. When the test is complete, the judge will give the rider on the spot feedback and coach the rider on how to better ride the test. The rider will then re-ride the same test immediately after the feedback has been given.

**Prix Caprilli:** A dressage class that will include jumps. Copies of the test will be on the NWDA website and are in the back of this Omnibus

Vintage Percentile TOC: Open to any rider age 50 and over. You choose the test you want to ride.

**Dressage suitability in Hand**; Open to horses of any age. Horses must be shown in a halter or bridle. All horses involved must be attached with some type of lead to a human. No free horses, even foals !! Horses will be shown at a walk and a trot on the standard in hand triangle and will be judged on suitability to ecome a dressage horse. This will include conformation, movement and temperament.

#### Payback Classes ( if held):

The payback classes will have cash awards in addition to the usual 6 rosette ribbons. The table used in determining the payback is shown below. The total amount available in each class will be 75% of the entry fees plus any amount received as donations specified for this purpose (with a \$25 guarantee). For instance, if six riders enter the class (Entry \$120x75%=\$90; \$90+\$25=\$115). This amount would be divided among class entrants according to the table below. **Donations will be accepted until the start of the class: please see the show secretary to donate prize money and add to the excitement!**

## Schooling Show Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Remember, these are schooling show specific rules. See the enclosed Frequently Asked Questions For All NWDA shows and Recognized Shows FAQ for more more information.

#### 1. What do I need to send with my entry?

Besides your entry form, a documentation of a negative coggins test performed this year, documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within 6 months prior to entering the stables and payment. Please see the Show Guide section on page 33 for the full GR845 vaccination rule. Vaccination Documentation is page 99 in Forms Section of this Omnibus. T.I.P. number if applicable.

#### 2. What equipment do I need?

Horses may be ridden with proper riding equipment based on the classes entered. English style saddle, saddle pad, and bridle should be used for Dressage, Hunter, and Jumper Classes. For Western Dressage classes, please see

http://westerndressageassociation.org/western-dressage-rules-tests/. No bareback riding allowed. Saddles must have stirrups.

**For Dressage:** Any extra equipment, including but not limited to: leg wraps, side reins, draw reins, and martingales are prohibited in the dressage ring and may only be used in warm-up or lunging

**For Hunters:** Standing martingales only allowed over fences, no martingales in under saddle classes, all types of boots, wraps and bandages are prohibited, no side reins or draw reins, regulation snaffles and Pelham bits with cavesson nosebands are recommended. (A judge may penalize for nonconventional types of bits and nosebands.)

For Jumpers: Standing and running martingales are allowed, no side reins, no draw reins

#### 3. How should I be dressed for competition?

ASTM/SEI approved helmet with strap must be worn while mounted at all times, no exceptions.

#### **Dressage, Hunter, and Jumper Classes:**

White, light or dark colored breeches or riding tights. Long or short sleeved collared shirt, and gloves. Full length riding boots or paddock boots with half-chaps, boots must have a distinguishable heel. Jackets may be worn, but are not required.

In the working gaits the jumping horse is not expected to be as round as a straight dressage horse but the horse must softly accept the bitand show more roundness in the non-jumping parts of the tests. Refusals will be penalized as error of course. Knockdowns will be penalized at judge's discretion. If a rail is in the way, the judge will ring the bell for rider to stop until the rail is replaced. The judge will then ring the bell/whistle for the rider to start where he/she left off. Copies of tests will be placed in the NWDA Omnibus.



All USEF Members 18 years of age or older are required to complete the core Safe Sport Training within 30 days of activiting your membership.

If you do not complete the training, you are ineligible to participate in all USEF activities, including competitions and it must be completed 48 hours before a Recognized Show

Take the SAFE SPORT TRAINING at USEF.org by logging into your member dashboard.

Accessing the Required Safe Sport Core Training

Please have your USEF member number available for this process.

- 1. Go to www.usef.org.
- 2. Click the red log-in button at the upper right-hand corner.
- 3. Click on My USFEF in the upper right-hand corner of the screen.
- 4. Click the Safe Sport Training icon in your Member Dashboard.
- 5. Click red Proceed to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Website to Register button.
- 6. This will take you to the Safe Sport Website to complete the training.
- 7. Click **REGISTER** to create a new account.
- 8. Fill out the required fields and click next
- 9. On the second "register " page:
  - a. You do not need to upload a photo.
  - b. Select your Primary Position with USEF. If you are an owner, please select athlete.
  - c. You MUST add your membership to US Equestrian in order to show up in our system as Safe Sport Trained. If you participate in another National Governing Body (NGB) organization, you can add that membership at this time. This will ensure that all USOC NGBs you participate in are notified that you have completed the training.
  - d. After adding your membership information, you must certify that you are that individual and click Save.
- 10. You MUST check the email you registered your account with to verify your account. The email comes from "no-reply@safesport.org." Click the link in the email and it will take you back to the U.S. Center for SafeSport website.
- 11. Enter your email and password and login to complete the training modules. All three training modules: Sexual Misconduct Awareness Education, Mandatory Reporting, and Emotional and Physical Misconduct must be completed in order to satisfy the requirement. The Safe Sport Refresher course does not have to be completed until 1 year from the day you complete the three modules in the required Safe Sport Training.
- 12. After *all three* modules are complete, print your SafeSport Trained certificate to keep for verification purposes.

Startng in 2024 there will be a four hour yearly volunteer requirement to be eligible for NWDA Year End Awards. you can volunteer for an NWDA event, at spring cleanup, the banquet, etc to fulfill this requirement, but it will not earn you Show Credits..

**Volunteering at one of our shows during the summer earns you show credits as well as fulfilling your four hour requirement.** You will earn 10.00 hour worth of credits for volunteering at shows. To incentivize volunteering as a scribe the show credit rate for that role is higher at 15.00 hour. A great way to make your show dollars spread farther. A family member or friend can complete your annual volunteer requirement. In case of unforeseen circumstances, and you cannot fulfill the volunteer position you signed up for, you are required to find someone to fill your position or no Year End Award. Please let the volunteer coordinator know, as soon as possible, if you cannot attend, she will try to help.

Please record your hours on the sheets provided at the shows or email the volunteer coordinator the event and hours you worked so that they can be recorded.

Volunteer credits may be used to pay for your class fees at any of our future NWDA shows or educational events. To redeem them, sign up and pay for your classes when you do your online or mail in registration as you would normally do. Then at the show you may ask for a refund check from NWDA in the show office.

Show credits expire two years after the date on which they were earned.

### North Woods Dressage Association Sponsored Year End Awards

The North Woods Dressage Association sponsors several categories of award for riders & horses that are current year members. Almost all riders & horses who participate in NWDA shows are eligible for an award at the end of the year award banquet. Both riders and horses must be NWDA members when the scores were earned to be eligible for any of the following awards. Forms are required for Achievement and Mastery Awards and must be completed and returned by November 30th.

#### **Achievement Awards**

If you received a score in any test, in any class, at any show, above 50%, you qualify for an Achievement Award! You and your horse must have been an NWDA member before the test was ridden, and you may only receive one Achievement Award per level, per horse, per year. Any classes hosted by a NWDA show are eligible, however scores can be earned at any open schooling or recognized shows, classes from open breed shows, and dressage tests ridden at an open, recognized, or schooling horse trial or event. These classes include, but are not limited to:

- Traditional Dressage Tests
- Western Dressage Tests (WDAA Tests)
- Dressage Freestyles
- Prix Caprilli
- Pas De Duex

Any test within the level will be an eligible test for an Achievement Award. The awards will be given at the following levels: Bronze Awards for scores from 50% - 54.999%, Silver Awards for scores from 55% - 59.999%, Gold Awards for scores at or above 60%, Premium Awards for scores 65%-69.999%, and Pinnacle Awards for 70% and above.

#### **Mastery Awards**

A Mastery Award is earned by riding mastering a level, either with traditional dressage tests or musical freestyle tests. To earn a Mastery Award, four tests within the same level with scores of 60% or higher are required. **Lapel Pins are awarded for each Level earned, that can be put on your show coat or barn jacket, as well as a Wall Certificate.** All tests must be ridden by the same horse/rider combination and must have been ridden in the last two consecutive riding seasons. Each horse and rider must be NWDA members when the scores are earned. For traditional dressage tests scores must include at least two tests at the highest level Scores from traditional dressage tests and musical tests will be counted separately and will not be combined.

#### **Adult Amateur of the Year Awards**

This award is sponsored by North Woods Dressage Association. It requires a minimum of four scores from three judges at one level. These scores may be obtained at schooling or recognized shows. Scores are recognized from Training level and above with the average score being 60% or higher. A score scale will be used to calculate the top horse/rider combination in a competition year (membership year) and combination must have been a NWDA member when the scores were earned. North Woods Dressage Association will present the winner with award engraved with the year and name of the winner.

### **Jack Pine Circuit Award**

This award is to recognize member show performance throughout the year. This award will recognize top Dressage, Hunter/Jumper, and In Hand performances for any show within USDF Region 2 and 4. Overall Dressage Jack Pine Circuit winner will be calculated using a Handicap System.

- Scholarships are available for up to **\$350.00 per person**. Reimbursement of funds will be provided no later than 60 days after submission of the recipient's expenses and receipts.
- The Region Four Scholarship Committee will select <u>one (1) applicant</u> to be awarded the Region Four Adult Scholarship each year. If sufficient applications are received for any given year, the Scholarship Committee may elect to award two (2) scholarships, one to an adult amateur recipient and one to a professional.
- The Scholarship Committee will review all applications and notify the winner(s) by phone or email no later than November 30, 2022.
- The event for which scholarship funds are to be used must occur within one year from the time that the scholarship is awarded.

#### **Requirements:**







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Tests confirm that the horse is building on the elements from lower levels and is developing more engagement to show sufficient impulsion as the lengthened jog and lope are performed. 


