Dee Closson wins 2022 USDF Regional Schooling Show Award

NWDA member Dee Closson, riding De Zebaron, a beautiful Friesian Cross, took First Place in First Level Adult Amateur for Region 4 in the Regional Schooling Show Awards Program* with USDF. She wanted to participate in the Regional Schooling Show awards to motivate herself to ride better and to see how she stacked up regionally.

She said it was a fun thing to do, and it didn't involve extra travel to get to a distant show, she

showed at our NWDA shows and submitted her scores online at the USDF website, and that submitting the scores was super easy. Your residence location is the basis for what region you are in, she lives in Minnesota, so is in Region 4. It doesn't matter where the show location is.

She had to submit her scores online and pay a \$35 nomination fee by Dec 21, 2022. She liked that you don't have to pay the nomination fee before your scores are earned, so if you have a crummy year, you are not out anything! She

submitted her scores as they were earned, but could easily have done them at one time before 12/21/22. She won a stall plate and a pretty ribbon which was mailed to her in February, and her placing was listed in the USDF Connection March/April 2023 edition.

There are 4 divisions, AA, JR/YR, Open and Non-Professional, in Intro Level through Grand Prix. Up to ten placings per division/level will be recognized. Both NWDA Schooling shows will

participate in the Regional Schooling Show Awards for 2023. Any non-USEF licensed/ non/USDF recognized completion may participate, but competition management must submit an application prior to the show date. The Score Requirements for Intro Level are minimum of three scores from two different judges from two different competitions. Training Level through Fourth Levels must have a minimum of three scores

from two different judges from two different competitions. There is no need to go to a non-NWDA show to qualify! Complete information and Schooling Show awards Rules are in the NWDA Omnibus.

In left lead canter, ride deep into the corner leave the corner in left lead, slight left flexion to inside, some shoulder fore as well. Maintain slight left flexion down the center line in the counter canter, look straight down center line, like you are looking the judge in the eye. Aim back to the rail move him over, half halt, move him over, half halt again, all done gradually, It is essential that you keep the horse straight and that you sit tall in the center of the saddle in counter canter. Then in corner half halt outside rein to rebalance the canter and continue in true canter, maintaining left flexion.

Start with just a shallow loop to the quarter line, then later to centerline, before progressing on to a full 3 loop serpentine, full width of arena.

The counter canter in this exercise is a straightening tool that encourages and then demonstrates collection. When ridden correctly it puts the horse in better carriage. When ridden crooked, the energy can't go straight through the horse, and it makes him worse instead of better.
